


DON'T BE MEAN, KEEP IT CLEAN!


Fulton County Public Works is committed to keeping you safe by providing clean drinking water and properly managing your wastewater. It can be challenging keeping water resources clean with a constant supply of litter - much of which ends up in our waterways. We use water in our everyday activities - brushing our teeth, showering, doing laundry, and even drinking a glass of water. Imagine how different that water would be if it was filled with pollutants. That's why we need your help to keep our water clean! By following the methods below, you can help reduce the amount of litter in our water sources:

- **REDUCE** your litter by buying only what you need! Choose items that have less packaging and that use recycled materials.
- **REUSE** plastic containers instead of throwing them away. Did you know that plastic bottles and containers are the most commonly found things in river clean ups? There are many fun ways to repurpose these items such as storage containers or craft supplies.
- **RECYCLE** what you can! Check with your residential waste hauler to see if curbside recycling services are available. If not, there may be a recycling center in your area.
- **TRASH? BALDERDASH!** Some things can't be disposed of by practicing the 3 R's above, so make sure you know how to properly discard your trash in the proper place.

Become a water ambassador by getting involved in one of our volunteer programs! Monitor the water quality of your local waterways through our Adopt-A-Stream Program or participate in a stream cleanup. Fulton County's Storm Drain Marking and Adopt-A-Drain programs are also quick and easy ways to impact your community and prevent flooding by keeping waterways clean.
